Congregational Meeting Update

Dear Siblings in Christ at TRC,

Yesterday we had our yearly congregational meeting as part of our Lord's Day morning. We celebrated with Word and Sacrament, worshiped and prayed together, and shared a meal. We were also able to have a vision update, select new members of the consistory and approve our year's budget for 2022. The budget passed with no discussion.

The new members of Consistory are Doug Walvoord and Scott Remenschneider to the office of governing elder and Kent and Maggie Franken to the office of care elder. There are still a few vacancies for care elder and deacon and leadership continues work on filling those slots as well as addressing the larger picture of our trouble with filing recent vacancies. The slate of elders was approved unanimously. Thanks to those who are serving.

We also recognized those consistory members whose terms were completed: Scott Millen, Dan Callam, Ben Lichtenwalner, Kim DeJongh, and Lucille Schroeder. We thanked them for their work and prayed for them as well as all of our Consistory as they continue to serve at TRC.

We also took some time to hear about the past year here at TRC. In a lot of ways, it marked a continued return of in-person programming. We celebrated the ways we were able to gather again and be with one another. We celebrated amazing growth in our El Encuentro ministry that has grown to over fifty people! We spoke about what we heard at the "Staytreat" about what God is asking us to do in this next season of ministry. We presented two big aims over the next few years: First, that TRC will live the Third Way—we will be able to hold the tension of our disagreements and show the world how it is that we can live with difference as a community. Second, that we can continue to grow into a place of belonging for all people who come here. Can we be such a place of welcome and enfolding that we are known for our hospitality? More will come on these things as Consistory approves a one and three year strategy for accomplishing these goals. Last month we talked about DITCHING THE PLASTIC. How is that going? Have you made any progress? Remember it does not have to be all at once. Start simple by eliminating one plastic use and when that becomes natural ask yourself what plastic can I ditch next. Although if you go gangbuster and ditch it all, kudos to you. Just don't give up, an all at once approach can be tough.

So what's next on the baby steps to going green list you ask?

SAVE WATER!!! This one is probably easier than you think. Start small. Turn the water off when you are brushing your teeth. Or how about a low flow shower head (if you don't already have one). And if you're a regular bath taker you may want to consider transitioning into taking showers. Don't get me wrong, soaking in the tub after a long day can be glorious, let's just try not to do it too often. And even now that the warm weather is upon us make sure you are not overwatering your lawn. Remember that 1-2 long soaks per week is all your lawn typically needs to be strong and healthy. Overwatering tends to allow your lawn roots to stay shallow and not reach down for the moisture it needs.

This month's book is for our 3-6 year old readers, "ABC Earth-Friendly Me: From Action to Zero Waste" by Christiane Engel. This book pairs aspects of eco-friendly living with each letter of the alphabet teaching young children their ABC's while encouraging them to be aware of their environment and the impact they can have on it. Engaging illustrations, fun rhyming, and simple concepts will introduce your child to an eco-friendly way to care for the earth.
