Disability Concerns

In August CRC & RCA Disability Concerns held a conference on Ableism, which is defined as "Discrimination in favor of non-disabled people".

Often people with disabilities are not asked to participate in activities because we don't get to know them well enough to know what they are able to do and their interests. Forming such relationships is important. Their involvement is limited to their being prayed for. For some people they are thought about mainly for their disability.

For some of them what is considered their disability is so much a part of their character they wish others would not assume they want their disability to be the object of prayer. Amy Kenny has written the book *My Body is Not a Prayer Re-*

quest about those who feel that way. Some congregations are forming groups of people who would be interested in reading and discussing the book. I would encourage anyone, including church officers, to contact me to participate in a group. Copies will be supplied by the Disability Concerns office. Recordings of both sessions "What is Ableism?" and the second session "How Can Churches Overcome Ableism" are available for viewing and discussion online.
