HOLIDAY OFFICE HOURS: The church office will not have reception hours the week between Christmas and New Years. While staff will be working, it will be both from home and in the office and on varying schedules. If you have need to visit the church the week following Christmas, please make arrangements ahead of time so a staff member can meet you. Also, please note the office is completely closed on Friday, December 23, and Monday, December 26 for the Christmas holiday; as well as Friday, December 30, and Monday, January 2, for the New Year's holiday.

CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICES: Our 5:00 p.m. service will feature children in a live nativity as the scriptures about the birth of our Savior are read aloud. We will enjoy a cookies and punch reception after this service. At 11:00 p.m. we will enjoy a candle light Christmas Eve service. YEAR-END GIVING: If you are planning to make year-end gifts to Third Reformed Church and want them credited to your giving record in 2022, checks need to be dated (and postmarked, if mailed) December 31 or earlier and received at the church prior toJanuary 6. With staff working remotely between December 23 and January 3, you may also place contributions in the offering plates or in the USPS drop box outside the main door during that time. As January 1 falls on a Sunday, we will use the date on your check for the year in which to credit your gift. If you are giving shares of stock, the stock should be received in the church's account by December 30 (last business day before year-end). If you are giving a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA, remember your trustee will need time to process your request and mail the check by December 31 for your gift to count in 2022.

Please pick up your giving envelopes for 2023. They are on the tables near the north windows of the Gathering Place. Envelopes for members participating in EFT are on the right side. To avoid confusion, please do not use new envelopes until January 1, 2023. If you haven't already turned in your pledge card for 2023, we encourage you to do so soon. Extra copies are available in the church office if needed.
