By now you should have recovered from your Thanksgiving meal food coma and moved on to checking that "list"...twice. In this season of one holiday after another it gets very easy to slack a little (or a lot) on remembering what it means to live a green life. With the stores full of holiday sales and the TV ads flooding our minds with the next greatest thing on the market that we CAN'T LIVE WITHOUT, I get it. But what if we took a minute to slow down, to renew our spirits and be at rest.

I know in the November issue I mentioned that we'd talk about food waste and what we could

begin doing about it. Then, as it so often happens, I read an article and decided that something else should be thought about this month. It's an article from Earth911 that talks about "making the holidays more sustainable." Feel free to enjoy the article yourself if you'd like but I will take just a minute to summarize it for you.

The article talks about 3 main points to consider when gifting, celebrating and decorating. Here they are...

Greener gifts - second hand gifts, non-material gifts or...

For your pocketbook and the planet look at your local second hand store or shop yard sales. Gift movie tickets or museum passes. Or if you need to shop, shop local and support the community and small businesses.

If there are leftovers or you plan on that to send food home with guests, invite your guests to bring their own reusable containers. And if you need a new tree, maybe it's time for a new tradition. Try creating a tree from materials you already have at home.
