# Holy Week Schedule

We have a full Holy Week schedule coming up.

## Need To Take an RMD?

Those of us who are 73 years of age or older have received a letter from our fiduciary in the past month indicating that we need to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from our IRA or retirement account during this calendar year and how much we are required to take. Because there were no taxes paid on the contributions made to our IRAs over the years, we will be required to pay taxes on these RMDs when we take it as income.

You may, however, make a charitable contribution instead of taking that amount as income and not have to pay taxes on the amount you choose to donate. That's known as a direct contribution to charity or a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). That can be done in any amount up to \$100,000 when you have your fiduciary organization send the check directly to the charity. If that direct contribution is less than your RMD, you will still pay taxes on the remaining portion that you take as income; if the amount is more than your RMD, there is no tax due on that distribution. You may also make QCDs to multiple organizations to fulfill your RMD.

During the past year, Third Reformed Church received 60 gifts totaling over \$200,000 from 34 of our members who used this option as a way to support the ministry of TRC. If you would like more information about using this possibility as a way to make a contribution to TRC or have questions, talk to Dave Vanderwel or your fiduciary about how this might work for you.

Nella Kennedy will sit down with Don and facilitate a discussion around his years of experience in teaching and preaching. Reverend Dr. Donald J. Bruggink received his A.B. from Central College, Pella, Iowa, in 1951 and his B.D. from Western Theological Seminary, Holland, Michigan, in 1954, and Ph.D. at the University of Edinburgh in 1956. He was licensed and ordained by the RCA Classis of Wisconsin in 1954 and served as pastor of the Fordham Manor Reformed Church, Bronx, New York, from 1957-1962, after which he joined the faculty of Western Seminary in 1962.

Don's books and publications include Guilt, Grace and Gratitude: A Commentary on the Heidelberg Catechism (1963), Christ and Architecture: Building Presbyterian/ Reformed Churches (1965), When Faith Takes Form: Contemporary Churches of Architectural Integrity in America (1971) and Worship the Lord (1987).
