One additional note on Care Elders: The consistory approved a new model for congregational care last month that included a restructuring of our care elders. This restructuring plan was published in our March 23, 2023 edition of Third Church News. You can access proposal attachment that was included in that issue in previous issues of Third Church News. This means that the number of care elders we needed this year was a bit in flux. At the April 18 meeting, one care elder agreed to be a quadrant leader and the others are either remaining care elders in their current role, retiring from their term or choosing to not renew their term. The nominations committee is hard at work filling the needs of the care elders for the next term and the care elders themselves are hard at work building the lay congregational care team. The list of names for care elder will come before the congregation for approval at a later date.

Thinking about an Estate Gift?

This past month the church received a gift from the estate of Cherry Overway, and this past week we received notice that Third will also be the beneficiary of a gift from the estate of a recently deceased member. We are deeply grateful for these demonstrations of the commitment these members had to sustain the ministry of the church which meant so much to them during their lifetimes. You may also be considering including Third Reformed Church as a beneficiary in your estate plan and wonder how you would do that and what that might mean for the church.

Most estate plans include an addendum or appendix listing the beneficiaries of the estate which describes either a fixed dollar amount or percentage of the estate designated for each beneficiary. Those beneficiaries normally include a spouse, children, other relatives, and often charities to which the donor was committed. In these two most recent examples, the church was designated for a percentage of the estate. Your estate attorney can help you set up or revise your beneficiary designations.

When you designate the church as a beneficiary, you may either designate a specific purpose for which you would like the gift used (e.g., Mission Memorial Fund, building improvements, debt reduction, etc.) or leave the gift as undesignated.

When Third receives an undesignated estate gift, we will put the gift into one of our endowment funds (like the Future Fund which makes 5% of the fund balance available each year to fund unbudgeted program or building expenses, or the Mission Memorial Fund 5% of which funds mission shares annually). 18th Century Pietism Part I: Freilinghuysen Rev. Dr. Dennis Voskuil
