A PLACE AT THE TABLE



"Black lives are beloved by God and by us," so says the sign that we boldly and lovingly placed outside our church. The Justice and Equity Team invites you to join us in partnership with I AM Academy. This summer we have opportunities to grow our awareness of history and systemic injustices, opportunities to celebrate and support the Black community in Holland, and opportunities to serve alongside Black leaders.

Two well-known Black leaders offer advice on moving beyond reading books and listening to podcasts, to entering a place of proximity with the marginalized in our community:

"Where love is the beating heart of justice, I al-

ways say we have to have a priestly proximity to people, particularly suffering people, because that breeds empathy, and empathy births love." — Jemar Tisby

It's actually in proximity... that we hear things that we won't otherwise hear, that we'll see things we won't otherwise see. The things we hear and see are critical to our knowledge and our capacity to problem solve." — Bryan Stevenson
