
Join us for ice cream at 6:30. Our meeting will begin at 7:00. Topics include Budget, HVAC Update, and approval of Care Elders.

Putting a Pause on the Pantry \vee

If you have come to the church this week, you probably noticed that the Micro Pantry is no longer out under our portico.

While the pantry has been very helpful to some people, especially when it was first instituted, it has become apparent that a couple of individuals are regularly cleaning out the pantry each time it is refilled. These are not just regular visitors, but persons who would strip the pantry bare except the cards and pamphlets in there. Unfortunately, this negates the good the pantry was intended to bring about. Therefore, we have put a pause on the pantry for now (it is stored in our basement).

What about the food we have on hand? Well, we currently have a couple of families in El Encuentro who, even though they are working, are very food insecure. We are inviting them to come and take what they need. The rest will be brought to the Community Action House food facility. Additionally, we have information in our church office about the Community Action House Food Club and other food resources for anyone who may come in with questions or needs.
