Consistory Update for August

Mark Hiskes, Vice President of Consistory

Pastor Janelle opened with a reflection on Exodus 30 and Matthew 17, which focus on the Temple tax. Remember that coin Peter found in the fish's mouth when Jesus told him to go fishing? No surprise, it was just enough for the tax. Her reflection on it was spot on, reminding us that when it comes to payments for the maintenance of the Temple (like, maybe, a new HVAC system?), God never fails his people. Have faith, folks. He's a God who gives freely.

The first order of business was to welcome back Ellen Awad, who agreed to serve as Governing Elder for one more year to step in for Carl Folkert, who had to step down for medical reasons.

Pastor Janelle knew, of course, the agenda for the night. First up on the agenda? The budget-and, after a tough financial year for Third, Jeff Beird couldn't have been more positive. We had a stronger than expected ending on June 30 for the short six month fiscal year (January - June 2023). What's more, thanks to some generous giving, we had a "killer July," as Jeff put it, giving us a good start to the 23-24 fiscal year. Yes, we do serve a God who gives freely: as we strive to get back to a balanced budget, let's keep reflecting that in our own giving.

was, as always, thorough. One thing has been clear throughout this process: Dave Boes knows his stuff, and Third is truly blessed to have him overseeing this project for us. He reviewed the proposal from Comprehensive Engineering, who will replace our air handling units but not our boilers because they are still in good shape. The bid came in higher than he and we expected, but some unforeseen problems have to be dealt with that will cost us more than what was anticipated. Compared to other HVAC systems-geo thermal, for example-this system will cost less and will be cheaper to maintain than the alternatives.

Dave also reported that we no longer have a water-leakage problem in the basement. What's more, after some tinkering with the old system, we are on track to be 35% more efficient in our energy use this year.

Consistory members asked questions, and then we discussed Dave's report. After a month of discernment, Consistory will take it up again at our September meeting and consider whether and when to begin the process. Meanwhile, be sure to thank Dave for the countless meetings, building tours, and trouble shooting he's undertaken to get to figure out the best use for our nursery room us to the point where, not only is the old system more efficient, but we as a congregation can also catch a breath before considering the next step

Following that we took up a motion to name Dan Bolt as Clerk of the Consistory for 2023-24. The motion carried.

We then heard from Dr. Madison Pierce, a member of Third and a professor at Western Theological Seminary. She shared her desire to become a Minister of Word and Sacrament by coming under the care of Holland Classis. This requires a letter of recommendation from our Consistory. She


Next up, the HVAC report from Dave Boes, which shared her faith journey with us, which began in Louisiana and, after many critical moments in camps and classrooms, it was a course on the "Theology of Paul" that convinced her of her vocation as theologian and professor. It was nothing short of an inspiring story to hear.

> A motion was then made to recommend to Holland Classis that Dr. Madison Pierce come under the care of Holland Classis. The motion carried. It was also noted that Reghan Harms, our Director of Children's Ministries, will also come under care of Holland Classis, but that will be by transfer from another classis and requires no decision on our part.

The night concluded with a discussion about the current nursery. After many years, the Zoermans are retiring from their work in the nursery, their last Sunday being August 27, and it was made clear that we are grateful for their years of service. The Consistory then met in small groups to generate some good ideas for using that space to meet the varied future needs of Third families during worship times. Consequently, a motion was made that Reghan Harms, our Director of Children's Ministries, will convene an ad-hoc team going forward. The motion carried.

Pastor Ryan told me prior to this meeting that he thought it would be a "life-giving meeting," and it most certainly was. A lot of substance and rich discussion made it clear that, just as Pastor Janelle reminded us about Peter's miraculous fish, God has given us many and varied gifts to share as we follow him in our Third way.

Deacon Bethany Bulthuis's prayer of thanks and blessing closed the meeting, and we were left to appreciate the beauty of a summer night.
