# The Corinthian Correspondence – Part Deux

During the past year, a dozen of us in the congregation explored the relationship between the Apostle Paul and the first century church in Corinth in the southern part of Greece. In the letter called 1 Corinthians, we heard Paul play out the implications of the gospel he had been sent to announce among the Gentile peoples of his day— "that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures." Paul showed how those who believe that message—in first century Corinth or 21st century North America—are taken by the Holy Spirit on a journey as the people of God. Our identity and our practices are formed by that message.

You are invited now to join us on the next part of the journey. This fall, we will explore Paul's fourth letter to Corinth, commonly called 2 Corinthians. Uhh, yeah, about that. In 1 Corinthians he mentions that he had written them an earlier letter, which we unfortunately do not have. So, 1 Corinthians was at least his second one. And the same thing happens in the letter we call 2 Corinthians. He mentions another letter sent just prior to it. So this letter is neither the Second nor even the Third letter in the correspondence, but the Fourth one that we know about. But being the second one that we have in our New Testament, we'll call it 2 Corinthians. In any case, we will discover there what Paul has to say about things like Comfort in the midst of distress, Purpose for our lives, and Hope for the future.

We meet weekly at 11:15am on Sundays beginning on September 10. This time would make it especially convenient for parents of children who

are in their own Sunday School classes at that time. We meet in Room 22 on the east corridor in the basement level. Come and give it a try!

# Register for Intergroup Dialogue

#### First things first: What is Intergroup Dialogue?

Intergroup Dialogue is a practice developed at the University of Michigan which trains participants to have difficult conversations well. Small groups meet regularly over a set number of sessions with the goal of developing trust, common language, communication skills, a shared understanding, and a commitment to serving their community. At Third, we have been using this practice to help us learn to talk about human sexuality and gender, and we're excited to continue our learning with another session of dialogue this fall.

#### Is the goal to get everyone to think the same way?

Far from it! The best dialogue happens when people who think very differently about a topic, or who have had very different experiences, come together. The goal of dialogue is to come away

with a deeper understanding of and respect for one another's experiences and perspectives, not agreement. We hope to have a wide variety of our Third community join us.

#### What if I can't attend all the sessions?

Because we will be sharing our stories and learning new communication skills together over the course of the program, it's important to have consistent participation. If you anticipate needing to miss more than one session, we recommend you wait until another offering is scheduled.

#### If I was part of the first dialogue cohort, can I participate again?

Absolutely! Your experience will be a valuable addition to the group, and you will have the opportunity to learn from those you didn't get to dialogue with in the first cohort.

Intergoup Dialogue sessions will take place Wednesdays after the LIFT dinner. It will begin on Thank You September 20th and run for 8 weeks. Please email the office at office@trcholland.org if you're interested in participating.
