Special Adult Education Hour on October 15

We are delighted to welcome members of the Mosaic and Corinthian Correspondence Class to experience worship in Spanish in El Encuentro on October 15! You may be wondering what that will entail, and we want to share a few things you can expect and look forward to.

- 1. The Spanish service runs from 11:30am to 12:30pm. Please enjoy an extra moment with coffee and friends after the first service, and make your way to El Encuentro a few minutes before 11:30. In this service, you'll notice it is very common and comfortable for anyone to arrive, or leave, as they need to. Please feel free to do the same as needed.
- 2. We will pause for a greeting time (passing of the peace) after the sermon, around 12:15 pm, also for the return of children from their classes. If you must exit, this time may help. We do hope you'll stay, however. What will remain of the service is a very meaningful weekly sharing of prayer requests, testimonies, and praises, the congregational prayers, offering and a closing song. We are arranging a second run of the church bus (or a van) at 12:45pm for all who stay to enjoy the entire service and greet new friends afterwards.
- 3. Each week at El Encuentro, we have audio sets with earbuds for all who wish to hear an English translation of the sermon. For October 15, we will expand the translation of the spoken parts of the service and the sermon. A brief printed outline of the service in English will also be provided. The songs will be in Spanish, but you'll recognize some of them!
- 4. The service will be streamed via Zoom; please note that the service is in Spanish, we expect to orient the Zoom audience to the English interpreter's microphone, so that you will primarily hear the translation (or explanation). A recording of the service will not be posted on the church website.

Finally, we want to say how much we value this shared experience together as a congregation! We are praying that Third will find much in which to rejoice as we worship with brothers and sisters from many other places, and in a different language. And we trust that any unease from newness will help us all to grow our instincts in hospitality for guests and new members. Your presence, your prayers, your open hearts, and your posture of sharing life together in Christ will be a great gift, even where words or language run short. To God be the glory! ¡A Dios la gloria!
