CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE: This year we will have one evening service at 7:00 p.m. This service will feature children in a live nativity as the scriptures about the birth of our Savior are read aloud. We will enjoy a cookies and punch reception after the

service. The offering from the Christmas Eve service will go to Resilience, which has experienced a 36% increase in calls to its emergency hot line and a possible 30% decrease in its federal

funding. This remarkable agency not only responds to victims of domestic violence with 24 hour crisis response, emergency and supportive housing, and follow up therapy, but focuses on prevention with a violence high risk program, and coaching healthy and respectful manhood in our local schools.

YEAR-END GIVING: If you are planning to make year-end gifts to Third Reformed Church and want them credited to your giving record in 2023, checks need to be dated (and postmarked, if mailed) December 31 or earlier and received at the church prior to January 6. With staff working limited hours between December 22 and January 1, you may also place contributions in the offering plates or in the USPS drop box outside the main door during that time. If you are giving shares of stock, the stock should be received in the church's account by December 29 (last business day before year-end). Instructions for a donation of shares of stock are available in the church office. If you are giving a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA, remember your trustee will need time to process your request and mail the check by December 31 for your gift to count in 2023.

In last week's newsletter, it was reported that during the months of November and December, the church needs to receive \$260,000 in income over that critical two-month period to meet our financial goals. Through this past weekend (as of December 18) we have received \$251,467 toward that target. With two weeks remaining before month-end, it looks like we will achieve that objective and go into the new year in a healthy financial position to sustain ministry in the months ahead when revenues tend to fall short of our monthly expenditures.

Thanks to all of you for your generous support of the ministry of TRC throughout this past year and during this important revenue period for the church.
