

New Key System Installed: Your Key Will No Longer Work on Exterior Doors

We recently made a major upgrade in security and accessibility by installing an RFID lock to our main parking lot doors. 

In the current debate around the founding values of this nation, important facts about the founding citizens of this nation and Michigan have been lost, including their actions towards freedom and equality. In this inspiring talk, Dr. Anna-Lisa Cox, award-winning American

historian, will detail new historical discoveries that reveal the ways that people of faith and the churches of the Revolutionary era were involved in moving those values forward, and how we can look to this past to give us hope for the future.

Dr. Cox's recent book, The Bone and Sinew of the Land, on the long-denied history of African American pioneers who settled the Midwest before the Civil War, was honored by the Smithsonian Magazine as one of the best history books

of 2018. Professor Henry Louis Gates Jr. praised it for being "a revelation of primary historical research that is written with the beauty and empathic powers of a novel," and New York Times best-selling author Professor Ibram Kendi lauded it for being a "groundbreaking work of research."
