## Trip to Costa Rica

Hey friends,

From April 12 to 18 a small team from Third Reformed Church will join some representatives from the RCA office of Global mission for a trip to Costa Rica. The members of this team are Pastor Angel, Pastor Ryan, Aspen Boes and Laura Baer. The purpose of this trip is to explore potential partnerships with our former discipleship and mission consultant, Jim Padilla DeBorst, particularly on the border of Costa Rica and Nicaragua.

Jim, and representatives of his team, have started a ministry in the town of Los Chiles, Costa Rica that serves immigrants from Nicaragua. As Third Reformed Church also has welcomed many of our newest members from Nicaragua, this gives us an opportunity to learn more about global migration from a different point of view and also exposes us to how Christians in Costa Rica are responding to challenges of xenophobia towards immigrants, as well as the assistance they are able to provide.

Additionally, the leadership team also hopes to learn more about future opportunities for TRC to send teams down for service-learning trips around themes of ecological ethics, global migration, and Christian community.

The team will report back to the consistory and lead a Mosaic class on Sunday, May 12th for the congregation to learn more. Please pray for the team (Pastor Ryan, Pastor Angel, Laura Baer, Aspen Boes, Luis Ruiz from RCA global mission, and Samuel Lopez from Frontera De Gracia) as they explore opportunities for the RCA, TRC to partner with the good ministry in Costa Rica. Pray for the health and safety of the team as they travel. And, pray for God to continue to provide for the people of Nicaragua as they seek safety and opportunity for themselves and their families.

## **Email Spoofing is Happening Again!**

## No, Pastor Ryan is Not Emailing You for Money

There has recently been a spate of counterfeit emails that many people in the congregation have received, with a subject line suggesting Pastor Ryan needs help or would like you to respond to his email. This is not the first time these emails have happened, and it won't be the last. A recent one I received had a subject line of BRISK, and the message read:

Hello,

Are you less busy at the moment? I have a request for you to manage it secretly. I will be going into a meeting in a few minutes; no calls, so kindly respond back via email.

Thanks

Email spoofing is a type of cyberattack that **targets organizations by using emails with forged sender addresses**. Because the recipient trusts the alleged sender, they are more likely to open the

email and interact with its contents, such as a malicious link or attachment. A couple of quick ways to identify a counterfeit, i.e. spoofed, email are as follows:

- The displayed sender name does not match the email address
- The information in the email signature, such as the telephone number, doesn't align with what is known about the sender (i.e., the sender is located in California but the phone number in the sig file has a Massachusetts area code)
- Check the email header for the RECEIVED line. It should match the email address that is displayed in the email

For instance, the email I received that I quoted above said it was from Rev. Ryan Boes. Here's what it looked like in my inbox:

☐ ☆ ∑ Rev. Ryan Boes BRISK - Hello, Are you less busy at the moment?

Now, because I am familiar with emails from Pastor Ryan, I was suspicious right away because his emails only say Ryan Boes in the sender line. Here's an actual email from Pastor Ryan:



Once opened, it is easy to spot the spoofed/counterfeit email. Here's a picture of the header from the fake email:



As you can see, two things are off:

The email address is not <u>ryan.boes@trcholland.org</u> (April 2024 comment: look at Gretchen's email above. Note that the email address there was "church.pastorsmail" at <u>gmail.com</u>, not Pastor Ryan's email).

• The picture is blank.

Sometimes these counterfeit/spoofed emails can be hard to spot, and they may come from anyone in your address book - Pastor Ryan, your second cousin twice-removed, your grade school best friend - anyone. So here are a few things to keep in mind:

- Does the language used sound different from how that person usually writes/speaks?
- Are they making a strange or out of character request?
- Does it insist you either only email back or that you send money?

If you answer yes to any of those, it's most likely a spoofing email. Don't reply, don't send money. If you are unsure about the authenticity of an email, call them, or email them separately (start a new email, don't hit the reply button) to check on the veracity of their request.

## Offering of Letters

"Speak up and judge fairly, defend the rights of the poor and needy." Proverbs 31:9

Since 1974, Bread for the World (BFW) has worked through nonpartisan political engagement with politicians of all stripes to advocate for the poor and powerless in the U.S. and around the world. BFW has worked to end hunger in our times by advocating for equitable and effective food systems, structures, and policies.

Every 5 years the Farm Bill needs to be reauthorized giving Christians the opportunity to advocate for a more equitable and effective bill to address hunger both here in the U.S. and across the globe. Last year was the year for reauthorization of the Farm Bill, however, as of now Congress has not completed this bill.

Therefore, the Offering of Letters for this year is once again calling on Congress to complete the reauthorization of the Farm Bill and pass a Farm Bill that:

- Protects SNAP from funding cuts and further restrictions.
- Increases funding for fresh produce within SNAP benefits through the Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program (GusNIP).
- Reduces food waste by cosponsoring the Food Date Labeling Act, H.R.3159/S.1484.
- Reauthorizes the Food for Peace global nutrition program at no less than its current level of
  \$2.5 billion annually and allows additional flexibility to provide the most effective form of assistance in each local context.
